Stages of Establishing Non-Profit: what has been done and what needs to be done

- -Create gmail account and basic web page done
- -Register business name/non-profit with State of Oregon (\$50) done
- -Apply for EIN/Tax ID with IRS (93-3170180)
- -Apply for 501(c)3 status with IRS (\$275)

Next Steps

- -Establish roles: president, vice president, secretary, treasurer
- -Bylaws: check Portland and Oregon bylaw requirements
- -Articles of Incorporation (State of OR via name registration, or...?) as long as one copy exists, this is sufficient
- -Go Fund Me for \$275 Non-Profit Inception (campaign as Kelly, not Ripple)
- -Set up bank account w/ non-profit/exempt status (may need to wait for 501(c)3 status to be granted)
- -Discuss project foci (these are ideas subject to brainstorm, collaboration, addition, revision):
 - Access: free acu + herbs for low-income, ethnically/culturally diverse communities (BIPOC, LGBTQIA2s+); establishment of Ripple Institute for Aging Well, offering acu + advanced nutritional care for elderly

• Experiential education: acu for K-12 students (K-12 schools, TRIO Upward Bound); Chinese medicinal herb garden for acu/herbal students + the public (see grant opportunity here) - possible involvement John Jemison (retiring in Dec 2023)/Brad Libby (UM Greenhouse Manager); farm SE Portland check name/Berly...; food/restaurant (spices/herbs... ginger, turmeric)

• Art, Music, Writing

- sponsor artists, musicians, writers (ex: needle statue project: read about it here and here) inspired by, raising awareness of eastern and traditional medicines (IMRC, university systems, local maker spaces)
- podcast/interviews (KBOO) w/ local Portland acupuncturists, patients, medical specialists (Steve's contact Sean Taylor + Armando; Travis Kern @ Root + Branch)
- book of stories about patient experiences with traditional and east Asian medicines
- documentary interviews of patients, practitioners, students, featuring artwork from above
- **Research:** increase collaborative research amongst graduate medical schools, traditional medicine schools, individual practitioners, and students (who at OCOM oversees collaboration w/ OHSU: Deb Espesete, Jamie Ralston-Wilson)
- **Education:** offer education-enhancing workshops, acupuncture school (Satya) << private foundations tend to be the ones offering scholarships for students studying eastern and traditional medicines>>
